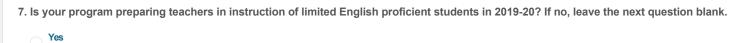

Candidates are taught to use technology for assessment purposes in the Classroom Assessment courses and in clinical practice. All candidates must complete either an assessment project or teacher work sample demonstrating the use of assessment data to inform instruction. Both include a technology component for the display of data.

Response to Intervention is discussed throughout the course in relationship to full inclusion and the role of the general educator. Candidates are also prepared to participate as an IEP team member. These skills are then reinforced in methodology courses.

In exceptional child courses, candidates are prepared to participate in IEP teams. They are encouraged to observe IEP staff meetings with their cooperating teacher during student teaching.
